Overview

Amid a macroeconomic backdrop of high inflation, weakening growth and concerns over financial stability, the monetary policy outlook for the US Federal Reserve and global central banks remains uncertain. This begs the questions what will be the future of financial stability and monetary policy?

OMFIF, held at the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia, is convening a global network of key policymakers, regulators and public and private sector investors in a series of expert panels to discuss the future course of US and global monetary policy.

This will explore the US and global macroeconomic outlook, whether the Fed's current mandate is fit for purpose, how it is tackling financial stability risks, and the implications of quantitative tightening.
